It's a School DÍA! iEs un DÍA de escuela!

Around the globe, Children's Day celebrates children and promotes child welfare. In the United States, *Día de los niños / Día de los libros* promotes literacy in English and other languages. It is an opportunity to share the importance and joy of reading and to celebrate our multilingual, multicultural identity.

Schools are where communities come together. Families from different backgrounds may not be familiar or completely comfortable with the public library system. Schools, on the other hand, connect all families. They are the perfect place to celebrate children and literacy!

Many *El día de los niños / El día de los libros* events will include children of different cultures who speak a variety of languages. Spanish Playground will focus on ideas for serving Spanish/English speakers, but the activities can be adapted to other languages or to include several languages.

Whether you celebrate *Día* as a school, a class or a family, you will want fun, low-prep activities to engage children with books. Bilingual picture books bridge languages and cultures and are a wonderful resource for your event.

Spanish Playground's Easy Día Ideas

- Tap into kids, parents and teachers to do read alouds. Include stories in languages other than English.
- Include a book exchange or book donation table where families can choose a book to take home.
- Invite parents and teachers to read a favorite picture book or excerpt from a favorite book.
- · Kids can illustrate parts of their favorite stories as decorations.
- · Set up a corner where children can read to younger kids.
- Have children present a reader's theater of a favorite book.
- Have a craft table where kids can color and decorate bookmarks or coloring sheets related to books. Include text in different languages.
- Have a "book review" corner where children talk about books they have read.
 Other kids and parents can ask about the books.

Spanish Playground's No-Prep Activities for Bilingual Picture Books

One Story - Two Languages - See printable activity.

In classroom centers or at a group event, display several bilingual picture books for kids to read. Put a *One Story - Two Languages* sheet with each book.

After reading the story, kids choose a word and find the equivalent in the other language. They record the word in both languages on the *One Story - Two Languages* page for that title. After your celebration, display the lists so children can revisit the story.

This activity is best with picture books with a limited amount of text on each page. It is great fun when a number of kids add to the list for each book. You can also adapt the activity for each child to work with one book.

Bilingual Bean Bag Toss

Make a target by arranging bilingual picture books face-up on the floor with the edges touching. Use a minimum of 3 books square and more for a larger target. Put something under the books to keep them clean if necessary.

Kids toss bean bags onto the book target. Assign points to the books if you want to keep score. When a bean bag lands on a book, have kids read the title of the book in both languages.

Words We Love

After reading a bilingual picture book, kids chose a word they like from the story in either language and write it on a sticky note. Put the notes into an outlined shape on a wall. Alternatively, kids put the words on small cards. Hang them with ribbon to make a *words-we-love* tree.

Picture Dictionary

After reading a story, kids choose a word and find the equivalent word in the other language. Children draw a picture to illustrate the word and label it in both languages. Display their drawings as they finish.

Alternatively, you provide words or a sentence from the story in both languages for kids to illustrate.

Bilingual Scavenger Hunt - See printable activity.

Give children a list of clues to words to find in both languages. The clues are general enough to fit many books. Kids can read several picture books to find their words. For example, clues might be: A word that starts with p in English. A word that starts with p in Spanish. A number in English. A number in Spanish, etc.

Key Word Bilingual Read Aloud. Read a book with integrated Spanish, like *Maya's Blanket* or choose 2 or 3 key words from the bilingual text to integrate into the English read aloud. Point to the illustrations as you use the words and encourage kids to repeat them. Once kids have heard and said the words a few times, pause and let them help you say the words as part of the story.
