





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

Themes: Individuality/Non-conformity, Self-expression, Friendship, Multiracial Children, Bilingual, Latino Interest




#### ;Olinguito, de la A a la Z! / Olinguito from A to Z! written and


**Dreaming Up: A Celebration of Building** written and illustrated by Christy Hale

Themes: Building, Children's Play, Concrete Poetry, Architecture, Creativity, Art

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


#### Marisol McDonald and the Monster / Marisol McDonald y el

A free-spirited, multiracial Marisol McDonald confronts her fear of monsters and unfamiliar nighttime noises.



A curious and active Asian American little girl spends the day learning tai chi from her grandfather, and in turn tries to teach him how to do yoga.



A spunky African American girl has a hula-hooping competition with her friends in Harlem, and soon everyone in the neighborhood—young and old alike—joins in on the fun.



A story of international adoption in which a mother weaves a magical web of tales to explain how her child came to be part of the family.





Themes: Shopping, Imaginative Play, Intergenerational Relationships, Family, African American Interest







A picture book telling the intertwined histories of the Puerto Rican parrot and the island of Puerto Rico, culminating with current efforts to save the parrots from extinction.





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


#### Catching the Moon: The Story of a Young Girl's Baseball

The spirited story of Marcenia Lyle, the African American girl who grew up to become "Toni Stone," the first woman to play for an all-male professional baseball team.



An African American boy nicknamed Bird uses drawing as a creative outlet as he struggles to make sense of his grandfather's death and his older brother's drug addiction.



A biography chronicling the life of Ira Aldridge, an African American actor who is considered to have been one of the greatest Shakespearean actors of the nineteenth century.








#### Tiny Stitches: The Life of Medical Pioneer Vivien Thomas

The life story of Vivien Thomas, an African American surgical technician who developed the first procedure used to perform open-heart surgery on children.




